## Recap of Housing Challenges:

- 1. Continue to advocate for having a strong voice from the Housing Committee.
- 2. Our direction comes from the Town Council's strategic plan.
- 3. Need to work quickly to recommend policy changes
- 4. Preservation of year round stock
- 5. Form a subcommittee to report back to Housing Committee which would review tax policy, permanent zoning issues and incentives (financial or otherwise)

Chair Carey moves to create a subcommittee of volunteers (four, so far) to come up with policy recommendations to create and preserve housing in all villages of Barnstable and report to Housing Committee. Don Lynde seconds. Aye all

Paul Hebert will announce this at Town Council.

## Update Inclusionary Ordinance:

The Wilkens project was enabled through zoning changes. New England Development was willing to comply with affordable units, but the Town Council thought it should be more which is a signal that we should revisit the inclusionary ordinance.

The residential exemption is only for homeowners.

Also time to revisit short term rentals:

- Put a cap on how many you can own.
- Put a cap on how many in the community.
- Only with homeowners that live in town.

There is an expectation that short term rentals are a land use that will be addressed by zoning. Town Council approved a collection of data on short term rentals in the community. We could take this issue back to Town Council now that there is more data.

The Housing Production Plan is due to be updated a year from now. Ryan Bennett encourages the committee to use it.

We also need to keep in mind the young workforce will sustain the work that seniors are leaving. The Town Council is having a public hearing on 10/21 with recommendations on zoning amendment. They are taking the position for more affordable and workforce housing with New England Development.

There is a big trend reusing commercial housing stock for residential units. Zoning would have to be adjusted to allow these conversions to happen.
