#### **RECREATION COMMISSION MINUTES**

06 March 2017

The meeting was called to order at 5:30, all commissioners present introduced themselves. Motion made by Richard Sawyer to accept the minutes for January and February as submitted, Renee Dowling seconded the motion with the amendment that her name be corrected for the January minutes. **VOTE – ALL IN FAVOR** 

# Public Comment – Little Free Library at Dowses Bathing Beach, Cyndy Cotton, Executive Director Osterville Village Library – Handout (Exhibit A) Cyndy Cotton presented the following:

#### What is a Little Free Library and what's so special about it?

A Little Free Library is a "take a book, return a book" free book exchange. They come in many shapes and sizes, but the most common version is a small wooden box of books. Anyone may take a book or bring a book to share.

Little Free Library book exchanges have a unique, personal touch. There is an understanding that real people are sharing their favorite books with their community; Little Libraries have been called "mini-town squares."

How did this get started and is Little Free Library a registered nonprofit organization? Yes, Little Free Library is a registered nonprofit organization that inspires a love of reading, builds community, and sparks creativity by fostering neighborhood book exchanges around the world.

How many Little Free Libraries are there?

As of November 2016, there are over 50,000 registered Little Free Library book exchanges in all 50 U.S. states and over 70 countries around the world.

# Can anyone give or take books from any Little Free Library? Do I have to return the exact book I take?

Yes, anyone may contribute or take books. The more the merrier! If you take a book (or two) from a Library, you do not need to return that exact book. However, in order to keep the Little Library full of good choices for the whole neighborhood, the next time you swing by the Library bring a few books to share. Little Library book exchanges function on the honor system; everyone contributes to ensure there are always quality books inside. This way, we all win!

Discussion followed. The entire Commission really likes the idea. Joe O'Brien made a motion to back the proposal for a Little Free Library to be at Dowses. Kathy Pina seconded. **VOTE – ALL IN FAVOR** 

**Pickleball Facility Request, Bill Dado – Handout (Exhibit B)** Bill presented a video showing people playing pickleball. Then presented the following: Pickleball is a fun game that is played on a badminton court with the net lowered to 34 inches at the center. It is played with a perforated plastic baseball (similar to a whiffle ball) and wood or composite paddles. It is easy for beginners to learn, but can develop into a quick, fast-paced, competitive game for experienced players. Pickleball is one of America's fastest growing sports. A wealth of information about the sport can be found at: www.usapa.org, which is the website for the USA Pickleball Association (brochure included). It is also one of the fastest growing sports for seniors. It is a valuable outlet both physically and socially helping to keep seniors young both in body and mind. Proposal: We propose that a permanent, dedicated pickleball courts be constructed in Barnstable. Discussion followed pertaining to potential locations, how many and to have Bill Dado be involved in the field study as a user. Joe O'Brien made a motion for the Commission to support a minimum of four pickleball courts to be presented for the field study. Renee Dowling seconded. **VOTE – ALL IN FAVOR** 

**Barnstable Little League Review, Joe Scott, President –** Joe stated have been the President the last three years. Have about 450 kids, 50 coaches, 30 umpires, our junior umpire program, 15 person board and many volunteers. We are the biggest on Cape Cod. Things are going good. Sign up is a little slow this year as we are no longer able to send our flyers home through the schools. Discussion followed with suggestions on other ways to increase sign ups. Reviewed Handout (Exhibit C). Joe Scott stated BLL wants a big voice in the upcoming field study; also, would like a real set of bathrooms at the Lorusso Complex. Further discussion followed. Joe O'Brien stated the field study group will be in touch with BLL.

Joe O'Brien congratulated Patti on the Peter O'Brien Humanitarian Award that you will receive at the MRPA conference, it is well deserved. All Commissioners agreed and a round of applause was given. Patti Machado stated highest honor in the state as a Recreation leader. Humbled to receive, I work hard but it takes the whole community.

**Liaison's Report –** Richard Sawyer stated the CPA had three items on the agenda. First a letter of intent from the Hyannis Athletic Association requested \$300,000 for their phase capital improvement project at McKeon Park, it was passed. Second item was Barnstable Land Trust's letter of intent for \$175,000 for a 3.47 acre parcel of land that is a vital link for the Cape Cod Pathway system, it was passed. The third item was from the TOB DPW Department for the Town Manager requesting 2.9 million dollars for all aspects and phases for the Osterville Bay project, they were moved forward as the CPA feels it is a lot of money and we need more information. Joe O'Brien stated the company Weston and Sampson out of Boston has been chosen for the land study. Kathy Pina read the email regarding Osterville Bay that she sent to the Commissioner's: *"The latest word on the Bay School is that the DPW is going to have bids back for the demolition by mid-April. This would allow the demo to take place in April/May, prior to the summer season, if all goes according to plan. Money for demo is already allocated in the 2017 budget."*
