Sandy Neck Board Meeting November 08, 2010

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Sandy Neck Board was held on November 08, 2010 at the Barnstable Town Hall, Selectmen's Conference Room, 367 Main Street, Hyannis, MA. The meeting was called to order at 7:31 pm by Chairman Rich French.

Act on Minutes:

On a motion by Barbara Bell and seconded by Pete Sampou, the Sandy Neck Board voted
unanimously to approve the October minutes as printed. Lynn Heslinga and George Muhlebach
abstained from voting because they were not at that meeting.

Staff Report:

Nina Coleman addressed the Board:

- The gatehouse is closed. Staff is available for the sales of ORV permits by appointment only. [Note: ORV stickers are required year round.]
- Winter curfew: Beach closes at 8 PM. Campfires are allowed at sunset.
- There is pheasant hunting at Sandy Neck and will continue until the weekend after Thanksgiving. Rabbit hunting is also active right now.
- This is turtle stranding season. The Kemp's Ridley Sea Turtles become "cold stunned" because of the drop in water temperature and beach themselves. These turtles are endangered and considered rarest of sea turtles. They are usually along the rack line mixed in with the seaweed. If you see one, do not move it but you can turn it over if it is on its back. Do not attempt to "warm them up". Call the Gatehouse or Natural Resources or the Environmental Police.
- Nina will be going before ConComm tomorrow morning (Tuesday, November 9th) to request a three year extension on the existing Orders of Conditions. These conditions are the documents that allow ORV vehicles and cottage colony vehicles to go onto the beach.

Old Business:

Bathhouse Update

Nina Coleman reported that the bids closed on Tuesday October 26th. Fourteen companies bid and the lowest bidder was Robert B. Our Company, Inc. of Harwich. The bid was vetted but needs to be signed by all the proper authorities and the Town Manager will announce the winning bidder. Then the contract must be written, reviewed and signed. The bid was \$1.1 million and includes everything – even the sidewalk.

Nina Coleman reported that there are no updates at this time but Bob Lovell, Highway Supervisor, has found some native material that can be used in the spring for some marsh trail repair work. Repair work will be reviewed in February.


