Town Council Meeting

April 5, 2012

quorum being duly present, Council President Frederick Chirigotis called the April 5, 2012, Town Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Hearing Room of Town Hall, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA.

PRESENT: Janice Barton, Ann Canedy, Frederick Chirigotis, James Cote, Jennifer Cullum, Debra Dagwan, June Daley, Jessica Rapp Grassetti, Michael Hersey, Janet Joakim, John Norman, Thomas Rugo, James Tinsley, Jr.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by President Chirigotis. Councilor Dagwan asked for prayers for the Calvary Baptist Church leader Caroline Smith who recently passed away.

Cape Cod Regional Transit (CCRT)

Cape Cod Regional Transit Administrator, Thomas S. Cahir, gave an update of the bus service (Exhibit A).

- Provides transportation for 15 towns, from Bourne to Provincetown
- Provides service six days a week
- Several fixed routes
- General fare is two dollars
- Dial-a-ride transportation is available
- Hospital Run everyday except Thursday

CCRTA has additional property (owned by the state) approximately 10 acres of land, that needs to be spruced up. There are no concrete plans for the area as yet.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

- John Julius asked the Council to figure out a way to help people of the Town. This is not a dictatorship. Figure out a way that the good people of this town can come here and get answers.
- Robert Tucker wished the Council, a Happy Easter. Tucker asked the Council to make Tom Lynch the next Town Manager, and don't spend the money foolishly for a search.
- Al Baker stated he wants public comment to be two minutes or more. Baker also said the village of Marstons Mills could use the old elementary school that backs up to Route 28.
- John Alden said the residents have a right to speak with responsibility. We need public comment at the Town Council Meetings.

COUNCIL RESPONSE TO PUBLIC COMMENT:

- Councilor Rapp-Grassetti wished Mr. Tucker a Happy Easter. Rapp-Grassetti stated she appreciated all the calls and emails she has received from her constituents.
- Councilor Canedy said, (not using any names) one of the people that comes here quite regularly she has tried to help. She is trying to direct this person to the proper authorities. Canedy stated Councilors do try to respond to public comment and their constituents.

Vice President Barton attended the Red Cross Hero's breakfast. Barton mentioned that both Steve Brown and the Barnstable Street Crimes Unit won awards. Well deserved, congratulations.

Councilor Canedy added that the Disabilities Commission nominated Al Melcher and received a well deserved award.

Acting Town Manager, Thomas Lynch introduced Finance Director, Mark Milne, who has been working on our budget. (Exhibit B)

• Finance Director, Milne announced the reduction in the bond rate to 1.56%, which will generate a savings of over one million dollars over the life of the bonds.

Councilor Dagwan attended Recreation Commission Meeting, and mentioned the summer program at HYCC. Dagwan stated the "Learn to Skate" figure skating show is on Saturday and is free to all. She told the Councilors the Recreation Commission is planning a tour of the playgrounds and fields starting in June, so they can attend.

Councilor Cote said the Osterville Library is open, come on by and check it out.

Councilor Cullum announced success with the Citizen's Resource Line, telephone number 508 862-4925. As a result of a phone call, two suspects were apprehended by the Police.

Acting Town Manager, Tom Lynch introduced this item and Chief MacDonald gave the Rationale.

A discussion ensued regarding the different types of vehicles that were available. We have the opportunity to purchase six (6) Crown Victoria's for the same price as five (5) "Police Interceptors." (a new offering for police departments to replace the Crown Victoria).

A discussion followed regarding the price of gasoline, 6 cylinder engine versus an 8 cylinder engine, and the expected use of the vehicles.

A motion was made and duly seconded to move the question. **VOTE:** Unanimous to move the question.

Upon a motion duly made and seconded it was

ORDERED: That the sum of \$154,878 be appropriated for the purchase of 6 new 2011 Ford Crown Victoria vehicles to be used as marked patrol vehicles, and in order to meet this appropriation, the sum of \$154,878 be transferred from available funds. **VOTE: Unanimous**

Acting Town Manager, Thomas Lynch, Finance Director, Mark Milne, and DPW Director, Mark Ells introduced the Capital Improvement Plan. Lynch introduced, Laura Cronin of CFAC, who prepared the sub committee report. (Exhibit C) Cronin explained how the committee of volunteers has been working on the capital budget, the criteria they use, and the detail of work involved. Cronin further explained there is no money in the budget for waste water at this time, but it is going to have a huge impact on the town in the future.

Finance Director, Mark Milne explained the prior appropriations and the closing out of prior encumbrances.

Director Mark Ells gave the rationale, explaining the criteria used to determine the status of the public roads and the planned maintenance. (Exhibit D)

- Upon request of the Town Council, Mark Ells read off a list of roads that are planned, for repair and/or resurfacing.
- Ells was asked to explain pavement index condition.
- Chapter 90 funds are received every year, which are used on the major local roadways.
- Residents on private roads need to email and or call the DPW, and Roger Parsons will come out to talk with you on the options available.
- This is maintenance and repair, does not include new projects, focuses on drainage, road surfaces.

School Facility Improvements

Dr. Mary Czajkowski, Superintendent of Schools, Deputy Director of Finance, Gareth Markwell, and Acting Director of Facilities, James Amara (pages 10 & 11-Exhibit C)

Czajkowski explained in detail the upgrades needed as follows:

- Bathroom stall replacements
- Exterior upgrades (downspouts)
- Electrical upgrades
- Interior Painting
- Tennis Court repairs

Concerns of safety in regards to the electrical issues were discussed. The facilities department is focused on all the safety issues in the school.

Are these figures fair and accurate? Acting Director of Facilities explained yes the figures are in the realm. When dealing with students, we need to use specialty products, for safety concerns regarding student allergens, etc.

All the school boilers have been converted to gas.

When the public uses the outside school facilities do we charge? Yes, we charge for public use of the fields.

Painting in the schools, is more that just cosmetic, it does help to keep the facility cleaner.

Emergency Center Generators Director Mark Ells, gave the rationale, and explained how the generators are used.

Hathaway Pond Septic System Director Ells explained that the existing system is failing.

Town Hall Interior Improvements Director Ells explained that these funds were previously approved. Ells stated now the exterior is now complete it is time to go forward on the interior.

Pond Protection Improvement Director of Regulatory Services, Tom Geiler, introduced Rob Gatewood, Conservation Administrator. Gatewood went through a slide presentation showing the problem with Hydrilla in Long Pond and Mystic Lake, and algae blooms in Lovell's Pond.

West Barnstable Community Building Improvements Director Ells explained the money would be used for design, permitting and placement of the septic system.

Sidewalk Construction/Overlay Program Director Ells explained this is an ongoing project to provide a safe walkway for our residents and visitors. Ells read a list of the streets that are included in the sidewalks overlay.

Centerville Community Building Improvements Director Ells explained is the continuation of work on exterior.

The local Centerville Civic Association has taken on the responsibility of having a fundraising effort to help restore and rebuild the adjacent playground.

Highway Building Roof Replacement Director Ells explained this money is to replace the roof on the highway building.

Ells went over the following multiple projects:

- The School Street, Hyannis Bulkhead requires immediate repair work
- Snows Creek, Hyannis-Rob Gatewood, Conservation Administrator, gave the overview with a slide presentation stating this will be the next project for wetlands restoration.
- Bumps River Bridge-identified cracks in the deck, etc.
- Bay Street Ramp is deteriorating, needs design and permitting
- Trayser Museum/Old Custom House-CPC funds and local funds necessary to complete.
- West Bay Breakwater stones are falling away; this will be a significant project.
- Old Town Hall continuation of project
- MEA facility septic system needs replacement
- Structures and Grounds needs a new septic system
- Ocean Street Hyannis parking lot needs drainage and resurfacing
