

Town Council Meeting December 7, 2017



quorum being duly present, Council President Eric Steinhilber called the December 7, 2017, Town Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Hearing Room of Town Hall, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA.

An announcement was made by President Steinhilber regarding the meeting being televised live and questioning if anyone was actively taping the session to please make their presence known. This session is recorded and broadcast on Channel 18.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by President Steinhilber, followed by a moment of silence; remembering those who lost their lives on December 7, 1941, and offering prayers for the family and friends of Doug Kalweit.

Len Gobeil, from the Cape Cod Regional Technical High School, recognized the winners of the John and Abagail Adams Scholarships; eleven students were chosen to receive these awards, these student will receive full scholarships to college.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Mark Segerman asked the Council to add an arrow to the intersection of between Pitchers Way and Route 28, for public safety.

Christine Greeley spoke about the proposal by Vineyard Wind. Significant issues about the proposal to put power cables through Lewis Bay for a wind farm. There are currently three bidders getting in line to take the place of Cape Wind. The deadline for the bid is December 20^{th.} A letter of interest from the Barnstable Town Council was discussed at the meeting and the town of Yarmouth Selectman did not sign. New 911 system, are they just from the town of Barnstable [yes, eliminates one transfer]; In the sign policy, can the signs be registered on line [will check on that and get back to the Council] When the contaminated soil was found at the Airport and sent to another location, are we using that soil [we are renovating the Lombard Field, the Contractor brought soil that was rejected; during the same period of time soil was removed from the airport, we would not take that soil if it was contaminated]

Snow and Ice Overview, Daniel W. Santos, P.E., Director of Public Works

Dan Santos, Director of Public Works used a Power Point program to emphasize the responsibilities for the removal of snow and ice on all roads, both public and private (Exhibit A);

Councilor Comments and Questions:

Appreciate the work of the DPW; instead of calling a Town Councilor to tell us their road is blocked; how should the public respond [send an email; or call us at the DPW] to report an issue what do you use? [you can go to the Town website, or give us a call] precautions for driving; is that through a reverse 911 [on the website we tell folks to stay off the roads, and in extreme snowstorms we use reverse 911] do you have enough subcontractors this season to move all the snow [we raised our rates to be consistent with the state rate, currently have a wait list] will the same contractors work within their own area [yes] fine job, is there a snow fence near the airport [no] can we have a snow fence near the airport [will check and get back to the Council] how can we participate, is it helpful to have the snow stakes [yes, it helps the driver to see the edge of the road] people who need shelters, who do they talk to [Lynne Poyant, Director of Community Services, you need to check in with the police department, they will pick people up to help those in need]
