




Watershed Permit Status

- The final Watershed Permit Regulations (314 CMR 21.00), and Title 5 Natural Resource Nitrogen Sensitive Area Regulations ("NSA") (310 CMR 15.214 and 15.215) went into effect on July 7, 2023.
- On September 1, 2023, the Town of Barnstable submitted its application for a Watershed Permit.
 - Barnstable was the first community on Cape Cod to submit its Watershed Application, per the new regulations.
 - As of the date of this report, we remain the only community, with neighboring communities having only submitted their Notice of Intent (NOI).
- Our application included the request for a Watershed Permit covering the entire Town of Barnstable, and with the request to remain on the previously approved 30-year implementation schedule.
- As of August 1, 2024, MassDEP formally notified the Town that our application has completed the administrative review process and is currently undergoing technical review.


Strawberry Hill Road Sewer Expansion Project



Status: Project Closeout

- Construction completed on schedule and on budget
- Paving restoration along the project route is complete
- Contractor is working through remaining project punch list items
- First connections for a portion of the project route have commenced
 - 151 parcels (220 individual dwelling units) eligible for connection
 - Includes: portions of Craigville Beach Road, Strawberry Hill Road, West Main Street, Wequaquet Lane, and Phinney's Lane
 - As of the date of this report, 7 residential connections have been completed
 - Feedback from private contractors has indicated heavy bookings for the month of September

Route 28 East Sewer Expansion Project




Status: Project Closeout


- Paving remainder of Phinney's Lane (Strawberry Hill Road to Wequaquet Lane)
 - Monday, August 19 Friday, August 23
 - From 8:00AM 4:00PM
 - Will require closure of this section of roadway
 - Media release and property owner notifications in progress
- Developing project punch list for contract closeout
- Sewer connections anticipated to be available by the end of the calendar year

Phinney's Lane Pump Station:

 Testing and start-up on-going throughout the summer

Centerville Village Sewer Expansion Project





North Phase:

- Bids opened on May 17, 2024
- C.C. Construction apparent low bidder
- Mother's Park Pump Station and surrounding properties listed as a bid alternate
 - Governor signed the Article 97 legislation into law; awaiting probate and Army Corps approval
 - State Revolving Fund (SRF) extension of award date to October 1, 2024
- Property owner outreach and communications following bid award
 - Construction anticipated Fall 2024 with completion end of 2026

South Phase:

- · Continuing to advance design
- Continuing effort to site pump station locations and associated easement options
- Construction tentatively anticipated for 2025

Notice of Project Change: Downtown Hyannis and Marks Path

- Updated Notice of Project Change (NPC) filed with MEPA on July 25, 2024 (EEA File Number 16148)
- Proposes adding 57 parcels within downtown Hyannis that are adjacent to the existing collection system
 - Specifically in densely developed sections of downtown; their inclusion in the plan was overlooked at the time of the development of the CWMP
 - Includes the proposed sewer pump station at 268 Stevens Street which will support the sewering of the additional parcels in this area
 - In 2023, Barnstable Planning and Development applied for and received a state grant to fund the installation of this pump station
 - The installation of this pump station is necessary for the proposed Housing Assistance Corporation (HAC) housing project at 268 Stevens Street
- Proposes adding 8 parcels on Marks Path in Hyannis in order to accommodate the replacement of the Marks Path sewer pump station
 - Recent evaluation of the Marks Path pump station determined that the station is at the end of its useful life and does not have capacity to accept additional flow
 - The Phinney's Lane Sewer Expansion Project will also direct additional flow to the Marks Path pump station
 - Evaluation of alternatives for replacement of the station have identified the best technical option as installing new sewers down Marks Path which will convey the flow to a proposed replacement station on Town property at 767 Falmouth Road
 - The Town and its consultant have commenced initial public outreach to garner neighborhood feedback, in anticipation of the NPC approval

720 Main Street Pump Station Replacement Project

Project Details:

- Part of the Town's Sewer Pump Station Rehabilitation Program
 - Will address capacity concerns within the Town's Growth Incentive Zone (GIZ) as well as replace aging infrastructure

Pump Station Construction:

- Onsite excavation continues
 - On-site work hours: 7:00AM 4:00PM
 - Foundation advancing above grade, initial pour complete
 - On-site work will continue through the summer season

In-Road Sewer Construction:

- Complete for the season
- In-road sewer construction to resume this Fall (tentatively October), to include:
 - Dumont Drive connection into pump station
 - South Street @ Sea Street connection
 - Sewer tie-ins on Main Street





Water Pollution Control Facility

Solids Processing Facility Upgrades

- Substantial completion issued on July 10, 2024
- Contract extended to August 31, 2024, to continue working through project punch list and closeout

Nitrogen Removal and Headworks Improvements

- #1 ranked project in 2024 Draft Clean Water Fund Intended Use Plan (IUP)
 - Appropriation and Loan Order 2024-112 for funding the Water Pollution Control Facility Upgrades Project on April 25, 2024
- 60% design drawings anticipated by the end of August
- MBR Manufacturer Committee has recommended Veolia Zeeweed MBR
- Construction start anticipated Fall 2025

Effluent Disposal Evaluation

- Water Reuse and Disposal Alternatives Analysis in progress with CDM Smith
- Hosting monthly meetings with MassDEP

Straightway & Hyannisport Water Treatment Facilities Improvements

Project Purpose

- Maximize the permitted capacity of the Hyannis Water System
- Increase the amount of water that the wells can supply
- Allow the water treatment facility to operate year-round
- Improve the water treatment process to further improve water quality
- Protect the wells and buildings from flooding
- Improve overall system resiliency

Project Status & Next Steps

- Public outreach process has commenced
 - Includes mailings to abutters within 1-mile buffer of the project area
 - Public informational meeting held on August 6, 2024; included translation services
 - All materials have been available in English, Spanish, and Portuguese
 - Project page available on Town of Barnstable website, under DPW > Water Supply: https://townofbarnstable.us/Departments/watersupply/Straightway-Water-Treatment-Plant.asp
- Next steps:
 - August 2024: 60% design in progress
 - September 2024: Filing Environmental Notification Form / Environmental Impact Report with public comment period
 - Fall 2024 Winter 2025: Final design and permit approvals
 - Spring Summer 2025: Bidding and contract award
 - Fall 2025: Anticipated construction start; approximately 2-year duration
