

View from the Village Green Current front entrance to the sanctuary with Bruce Hall to the right







View from School Street



At Cotuit Port, the Baptists, Methodists and Congregationalists joined to erect the Union Meeting House in 1846. This was the first Federated Church in America. It was built by shareholders, many of who were whaling captains.




The church's exterior was completely transformed into Colonial Revival style by the Boston architect A.A. Diriam Rebuilding


Plan Design Shared at July 20, 2021 Historical Commission Meeting





Anticipation Completion of Entire Project is September to October 2022




COVENANT OF WELCOME

No matter who you are or where you are on that journey, you are more than welcome here.






