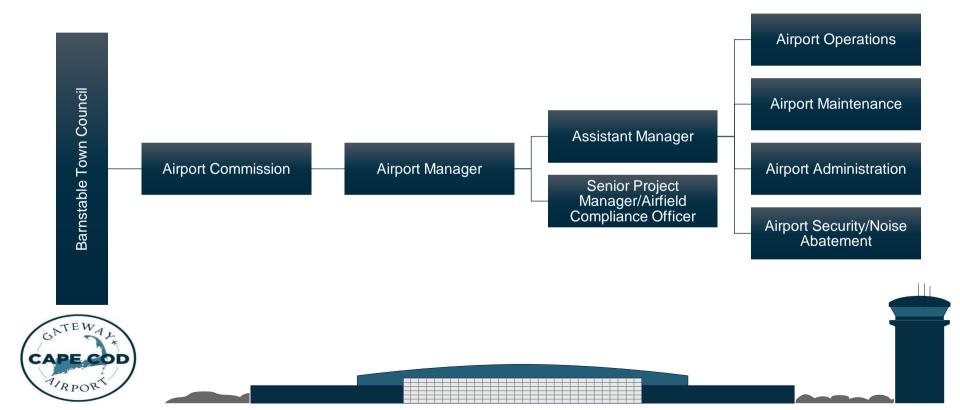

### Airport Operations

- → 10 full time Operations Specialists
- → ARFF (Aircraft Rescue Firefighting)
- → Aircraft fueling (jet fuel)
- → Airfield Inspections
- → Service tenant and transient aircraft









#### Airport Maintenance

- → 9 Full time Maintenance staff
- → Maintain Runways & Taxiways
- → Airport owned buildings
- → Mow grass on our 639 acre parcel
- Maintain and repair all airfield lighting
- → Handle snow removal for airfield and terminal roads
- Maintain and repair all airport vehicles







### FY2023 Budget Summary

- → FY23 budget was conservative to account for normalization post-COVID = **\$9,755,050\*** 
  - \* The FY 2023 budget included a supplemental appropriation fuel purchases (\$3.8M bringing this line item to \$7.5M).
- → Revised FY2023 Budget = \$13,566,549\*
- → Budget Status as of 5/24/2023:
  - o Revenues = \$16,039,287
  - Expenses = \$9,748,518
  - Certified Cash Reserves (6/1/2022)= \$8,878,844

### FY2024 Proposed Budget

- → Proposed = \$ 11,974,435
  - \$1.6M (11%) decrease over
     FY2023
  - The jet fuel cost center has seen significant swings since COVID with 1.4M gallons sold in FY22 but we are starting to see a return to pre-COVID sales

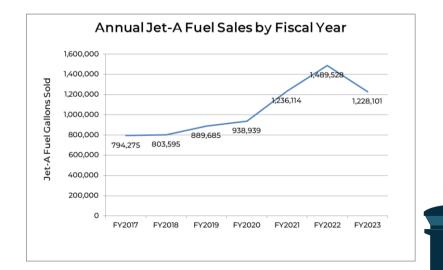

### FY2024 Proposed Budget

- → Proposed Budget = \$ 11,974,435
  - Conservative approach in all areas
  - The budget accounts for new tenants with signed leases
  - And added fee generation anticipated with new activity/tenants





# FY2024 Proposed Budget (Revenue)

- → Revenues similar to FY2023 but with jet fuel sales highlighting the bulk of the budget (\$7.4M)
- → Airline, car parking, and ancillary revenues still depicting marginal improvements and reflecting new operators/tenants
  - ↑ \$40K = Landing fees over FY2023 (back to averages in the past/improvements in FY24 and new flights (JetBlue)
  - ↑ \$70K = Car rental concession over FY2023 (back to averages in the past/improvements in FY24 budget and strong revenues to date)
  - ↑ \$15K = Vehicular parking (accounts for marginal improvements and \$60K reduction in construction payment plus new leases)
  - ↑\$86K = Land/facility leases = new tenants and lease renewals with annual 3%/CPI increases (whichever is greater)

## FY2024 Proposed Budget (Expenses)

- → Expense similar to FY2023 but also adding:
  - Normalized fuel purchases for resale (\$5.6M).
  - Resumed 5 seasonal positions & increased wages (\$4K)
  - Healthcare increases (↑ 10%)
  - Increases in insurance premiums (↑ 10%)
  - Deferred COVID asset maintenance (↑ \$350K)
