What is MassReconnect?

- Initiated by the Governor and Legislature for FY2024. • \$20 million allotted for the first year along with \$100,000 for each college.
- Makes community college free for those who: ٠
 - Are 25-or-older at the start of their classes
 - Do not already have a college degree
 - Are Massachusetts residents
- The intent is to expand access to higher • education for adult learners, providing them with the education and credentialing needed to move forward with local careers.
- Community colleges educate more than half of all ٠ students enrolled in higher education in Massachusetts.









What is MassReconnect?

- This is a **last dollar** scholarship. •
- Before State dollars are distributed, eligible • students must first complete the FAFSA. Once all other aid is distributed, MassReconnect funding kicks in.
- **Important to Note:** the majority of our students • ARE eligible for financial aid and would have attended college for free just by doing the FAFSA!
- Since launched: 1,144 students have attended for • free!
- 511 under-25 .
- 933 25-or-older. •
