Special Events: TOB Definition

Permits for the use of town property for a temporary event leisure, social, community, or cultural experience external from routine programs, occurring indoors or outdoors, for the public to participate in through invitation, general admissions, or free of charge.

Town Sponsored holiday activities (Veterans Day ceremony, wreath laying activities, fireworks, Unity Day, Touch-a-Truck events, etc.)

Not Included:

- Schools permit out their own events and use of School property through facilities.
- Community Services Manages events inside the HYCC, and at the recreation buildings.
- MEA has fishing tournaments at Wequaquet Lake.
- Airport permits out its own events at the terminal and on the grounds.

History of these events

100+ years ago - Town Meeting - the Town Band (to play on July 4th) or to have a Veterans Day or Memorial Day Parade.

Special Events - Number has increased over the last 35 years.

Fireworks Displays, 4th of July Hyannis parade, Pops by the Sea (1986), Father's Day Car Show (1996), Best Buddies Challenge (1998), Hyannis Marathon Time Trials - 45 years in 2025.

2014: The former Consumer Affairs Division was tasked to Town Council to review the permitting practices for special events.

Recent changes


2014 Future Recommendation: a full-time person - Due to the number of departments involved and the increasing number of events every year, there was a consensus from the team that was coordinating Special Events that the permitting, planning, day of on-site responsibility, and dealing with the post-event problems or improvements needed better coordination.

2016 - 2017: Cost evaluations were conducted and found each event cost about \$2,922.66 in staff time. (Approximately 50 to 60 events)

2016: Fees were raised for the first time in 15 years from \$43 per event to \$50/day for an event without beer and wine to \$100/day with beer and wine.

2019: The fee schedule was updated once more with an average 10% increase.

On-line Permitting

On-line platform allowed interested event organizers to apply for their events:

- Town calendar
- Identify the size, duration and number of attendees.
- The Town resources (police, trash, DPW items).
- Tents appropriate forms and approvals through Inspectional Services
- Food trucks (Board of Health) limited locations
- Use of Propane or open flames, to the local fire department
- Electricity on-site
- Entertainment or alcohol Licensing (special one day permit)
- Road closure permits
- Signage for road races or triathlons
- Communications plans
- Signage
- Banners across main street
- Insurance
