

Astronau ŧ Mae Jemison

Jemison became the first Black woman in space in 1992 as an astronaut on the second launch of the Space Shuttle Endeavor. This achievement is even more admirable when you consider the fact that Jemison was afraid of heights. Jemison was successful at an early age, starting Stanford University when she was just 16 years old. In 1981 she earned her MD from Cornell University. Afterwards she served two years in the Peace Corps and subsequently joined NASA up her return. And if that wasn't cool enough, she also accepted an offer to guest star on Star Trek: The Next Generation, which was meaningful because the original series was a favorite of hers as a child.





Going on now through through March, from 7:00AM to 5:00 PM, West Main Street will be closed from Strawberry Hill Road to Pleasant Park Avenue as shown in Figure 1 below.

The closures are necessary due to work associated with the gravity sewer main installation work. Formal road closure and detour will be in place, with resident and business access only.
