## Town Council Meeting - Thursday, June 3, 2021

# The June 4, 2021 Barnstable Town Council Meeting was physically closed to the public to avoid group congregation. The public was able to view through Live Streaming on the Town of Barnstable's website or Comcast Channel 18.

Town Council President Matthew Levesque opened last night's <u>Town Council Meeting</u> by inviting Councilor Nikolas Atsalis to lead the <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u>. President Levesque asked that everyone observe a Moment of Silence. Next up was <u>Public Comment</u> which was followed by <u>Council response to</u> <u>Public Comment</u>. Town Councilor Kris Clark offered a tribute to shellfisherman John Nawoichik who recently passed away. Mark Ells, Town Manager, presented <u>Town Manager Communications</u> for the period of May 21-June 3, 2021:

- 1. Andy Clyburn, Assistant Town Manager, will provide an update on our continued support efforts during the State of Emergency.
- 2. Andy Clyburn, Assistant Town Manager, will provide an update regarding public access to municipal facilities and some of the operational changes moving back to in person delivery of municipal services.
- 3. Andy Clyburn, Assistant Town Manager, will provide an update regarding the lifting of the State of Emergency on June 15, 2021 and how that effects certain provisions of the Open Meeting Law.
- 4. The Town of Barnstable will celebrate Independence Day with fireworks (weather permitting with an alternate date of Labor Day) and a day-long celebration on Hyannis Main Street. Barnstable is working in collaboration with community partners to host a celebration on Sunday, July 4<sup>th</sup> on the Village Green, Main Street, and Hyannis Harbor. There will be family-oriented entertainment all day including entertainers, the roaming railroad, DJs, bands and other live

music. We are not planning on a Main Street parade. I will provide you and our community with more details as they become available.

- 5. The lifting of the State of Emergency on June 15, 2021 raises the question of outdoor business spaces permitted for use on Main Street Hyannis this summer. Many people are asking if the Town plans on keeping the concrete barriers in place. The outdoor spaces are permitted by the Town through the August 15 and we intend to leave the blocks in place through that date. We have received a petition from businesses on the west end of Main Street from Bassett Lane to Sea Street to remove the barriers. We do have a business that is permitted for outdoor space along that section of Main Street. We will honor that permitted obligation and also look act safe and functional modification to barriers along that section of Main Street. I will keep you advised of any further changes regarding this issue.
- 6. We are proceeding with the tasks in the budget action calendar for FY 2022 as scheduled. We distributed hardcopies of the FY 2022 proposed operating budget to the Town Council on Monday, May 11<sup>th</sup> and posted the electronic version of the document to the website on May 11<sup>th</sup>. We submitted the recommended FY 2022 Operating Budget to the Town Council for a first reading on May 20, 2021. We will proceed with the second reading and the budget hearing later this evening. I want to thank Director Milne and our staff for the preparation and submittal of the Proposed FY 2022 Operating Budget. I would also like to thank the Comprehensive Financial Advisory Committee for their review and favorable recommendation of the proposed operating budget that was forwarded to Town Council on May 25, 2021.
- 7. On May 20, 2021 the Town Council held the public hearing on a proposed Sewer Assessment Ordinance as part of the fiscal policy under consideration by Town Council to establish how to equitably distribute the remaining cost of the Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan. A reviewed proposed Sewer Assessment Ordinance reflecting the amendments as approved by Town Council will be posted on the Town Website and made available to Town Council by June 17, 2021 in anticipation of the next scheduled hearing regarding this proposed ordinance on July 1, 2021. The Town Manager's proposal to Town Council regarding fiscal proposed fiscal policy involved a two-step approach:
  - First, review and approve the proposed Sewer Assessment Ordinance which includes a sewer assessment to each individual property receiving the planned sewer; and
  - Second discuss the use of general funds to pay for the remaining portion of cost associated with proceeding with the CWMP.

After discussions with Town Council leadership I am requesting a workshop with Town Council in August 2021 to discuss the second fiscal policy discussion which focuses on use of general funds to address any remaining costs beyond those covers by existing revenue sources.

- 8. Relative to the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds being distributed in Massachusetts, I was asked by the Lieutenant Governor and participated in (June 2, 2021) a working group to determine how ARPA funds will be distributed in Commonwealth to best leverage local and state efforts. I expect that we may have subsequent discussion specifically regarding how best to maximize the use of these funds to reach long term goals of the Commonwealth and our communities. There are four major categories of eligible expenditure for these ARPA funds, (1) direct expenses related to COVID response, (2) revenue lost as a result of COVID, (3) costs associated with first responder expenses, and (4) infrastructure projects specifically water, wastewater and broadband. There are other categories of eligible expense reimbursement and further clarification is forthcoming. I will keep you advised as we progress on this matter.
- 9. We continue to have regular conversations with Vineyard Wind (VW) regarding the status of the Phase I and Phase II projects. Vineyard Wind continues to work with Barnstable staff regarding

both Phases of the project. They anticipate commencing construction on Phase I in 2021 and are proceeding with permitting on Phase II. We have continued our discussion with Vineyard Wind regarding an update to the Host Agreement for Phase II and a Host Agreement for a potential Phase III. I offer the following itemized update from Vineyard Wind regarding their ongoing efforts:

- This spring VW conducted some brief survey work nearshore and onshore for Phase I and Phase II, and they seek to minimize any disturbance during the summer season. VW began prep work at the substation site in Independence Park.
- VW has begun permitting for Vineyard Wind Phase II and they anticipate the permitting processes to continue for about two years.
- The Federal process happens somewhat independent of the State process, the latter involve Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act Office (MEPA) and Energy Facilities Siting Board (EFSB) separately and concurrently.
- The State's MEPA process must be completed before the project seeks state and local permits.
- Vineyard Wind has submitted its permitting using the envelope approach that was used with Vineyard Wind 1 - with preliminary permitting capturing a wide range of options, and narrowing that set of options (the "envelope") based on technical, community, regulator and stakeholder input.
- The Federal permitting process includes evaluation of a Phase III landing in Barnstable. State permitting has not begun yet for Phase III.
- Phase III is likely to be in the vicinity of Craigville Beach or west, due to the location of the substation they need to connect to. Vineyard Wind anticipates discussions regarding potentially feasible options with the town in the coming months, as well as to continue the dialogue with town staff to maximize coordination with town infrastructure, to minimize community disturbance, etc.

I will keep you advised of our progress on this matter.

Old Business began with Department of Public Works Director Dan Santos, who was joined by Solid Waste Division Supervisor P.J. Kelliher, presented Agenda Item 2021-177 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$400,000 to fund disposal costs at the Solid Waste Division of the Department of Public Works which was approved. Airport Manager Katie Servis presented Agenda Item 2021-141 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$6,612,196 for Cape Cod Gateway Airport Enterprise Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget which was approved. Superintendent Meg Mayo-Brown, School Committee Chair Mike Judge, and Deputy Finance Director Gareth Markwell presented Agenda Item 2021-142 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$73,520,899 for Barnstable Public School's Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget was approved. Chief Matthew Sonnabend, supported by Finance and Support Services Director Anne Spillane, presented Agenda Item 2021-143 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$15,373,934 for Barnstable Police Department Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget which was approved. Planning & Development Director Elizabeth Jenkins, joined by Assistant Director Kate Maldonado and Conservation Administrator Darcy Karle, presented Agenda Item 2021-144 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$2,135,301 for the Planning and

Development Department Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget which was approved. Community Services Director Madeline Noonan was joined by Recreation Director Patti Machado, Assistant Recreation Director John Gleason, and Council on Aging Director Donna-Marie Burns in presenting Agenda Item 2021-145 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$2,395,834 for the Community Services Department General Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget which was approved. Community Services Director Noonan was joined by Director of Golf Operations Bruce McIntyre in presenting Agenda Item 2021-146 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$3,368,382 for the Golf Course Enterprise Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget which was approved. The Town Council voted to go beyond 11:00 PM. Community Services Director Noonan and Recreation Director Machado presented Agenda Item 2021-147 Appropriation Order in the amount of **\$2,891,546** for the Hyannis Youth and Community Center Enterprise Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget which was approved. Marine and Environmental Affairs Director Derek Lawson was joined by Natural Resources Division Director Nina Coleman and Harbormaster Brain Taylor in presenting Agenda Items 2021-148 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$1,261,370 for the Marine & Environmental Affairs Department General Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget; 2021-149 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$714,586 for the Marina Enterprise Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget; 2021-150 Appropriation and Transfer Order in the amount of \$27,465 for the Marina Enterprise Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget; 2021-151 Appropriation Order in the amount of \$876,812 for the Sandy Neck Park Enterprise Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget; and 2021-152 Appropriation and Transfer Order in the amount of \$108,000 for the Sandy Neck Park Enterprise Fund Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget which were approved. ## School Committee Meeting – Wednesday, June 2, 2021

The June 2<sup>nd</sup> School Committee meeting started with the Committee recognizing Barnstable High School seniors Shawn Calle and Audrey Sawyer as the winners of the Superintendent Academic Excellence Award. These awards are given to high school students who have distinguished themselves in the pursuit of excellence during their high school careers. The criteria for the awards include students being in the top 5% of their class and their three-year cumulative average.

- Shawn is a native Spanish speaker who started out as an English Language Learner, was selected for Gateway Math in elementary school, and was in Gateway STEM in intermediate school. At Barnstable High School, Shawn entered the Project Lead the Way Engineering Program and is on the school's competitive Math Team. He is also an all-star athlete playing varsity soccer and was the Captain of the varsity volleyball team this year. Shawn plans to study Civil Engineering at the University of New Hampshire next fall.
- Audrey has a creative spirit and scientifically focused mind with a passion for environmental conservation. She created her own fashion line in her independent study and is working with Barnstable Clean Water Coalition to collect samples to understand water pollution on the Cape. Audrey co-founded the Students for Sustainable Fashion to work to bring awareness and response to corrupt practices in the industry. She is the current President of the Green Club and recently organized a clothing drive where students were able to exchange donations for desired apparel. Audrey will be attending the University of Vermont this coming fall to pursue a degree in Environmental Studies.

Barnstable High School Teachers and soccer coaches, Doc Docherty and Meghan Fligg, spoke about their program United Kidz Sports Development, which develops community minded youth leaders, while enabling them to foster a desire to make an impact locally and globally. They explained how this program could be used as a model in the Barnstable Public Schools and for the 8<sup>th</sup> grade class the "BHS Experience." They use a purposeful play model to design curriculum that uses movement and wellness education to explore social issues, cultural diversity, and implement project based learning. This model can be used in the classroom where students can work in collaborative environments to address social issues within their community. They then could work through the project based learning curriculum in order to design, create, and implement projects that address their chosen social issues and create tangible change. The Committee agreed their plan was a great start for the 8<sup>th</sup> grade "BHS Experience" class. Superintendent Mayo-Brown stated they were going to start implementing their ideas in next year's class.

It is June and that means the school year is coming to an end. The students, staff, administration, parents, and community made it through a year like no other. Congratulations to the Class of 2021 who received shirts at a senior event recently that nicely summed up this school year: "I stayed safe, worked hard, made it through, now watch what I do."

## **Cyanobacteria Notice**



As we enter the summer season, we wanted to let you know the Town is planning to resume cyanobacteria monitoring and reporting. However, this program will have a delayed start this year due to unanticipated staff turnover. We expect the program to resume in July. Until this program is back up and running, we wanted to provide some tips to identify cyanobacteria blooms, what to do if you suspect a bloom, and who to contact.

#### Identifying Cyanobacteria Blooms

### How do I know if there is a harmful algal bloom in the water?

Cyanobacteria can cause the water to appear slightly discolored, cloudy, or resemble pea soup or paint. They are usually blue or green but can also be brown or red. They can also give the water a bad odor. The cyanobacteria in some blooms are dispersed throughout the water, while in other blooms they are concentrated in a scum or mat, either on the surface of the water or in sediment along the shoreline.

<u>What if you Suspect a Cyanobacteria Bloom?</u> WHEN IN DOUBT, STAY OUT! If you see a possible cyanobacteria bloom, avoid contact with the water.

### Federal Communications Commission Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

The Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) is a temporary subsidy program from the Federal Government designed to help low-income households connect to the Internet and stay connected during the COVID-19 crisis. Qualified households can receive a temporary monthly credit of up to \$50/month (up to \$75/month for customers in Tribal lands) toward their Internet service and leased Internet equipment until the program's funding runs out. Households can qualify through their use of existing assistance programs like SNAP, Medicaid, Lifeline or if a child relies on reduced-price school meals programs. The Emergency Broadband Benefit is also available to households who are eligible for a broadband provider's existing relief program, to those who have received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year, and to those low-income households who suffered a large loss in income during the pandemic due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020. ## **ROAD WORK UPDATES**

As always please slow down and use extreme caution when traveling through the road construction areas and follow posted safety and detour signs.

## \*COMPLETE\* Drainage & Pavement Improvements on Huckins Neck Road in Centerville/Barnstable Village

Line striping is scheduled for the week of May 31, 2021 weather permitting. This is the final remaining activity on the project.

## **\*UPDATED\*** Roadway Improvements on Winter Street in Hyannis

Tree clearing work will be ongoing during the week of June 7, 2021 on Winter Street in Hyannis. Several large trees within the existing sidewalk areas will be removed in preparation of sidewalk and roadway improvements that are scheduled to begin after the Labor Day holiday, 2021. The improvements are designed to facilitate pedestrian and vehicular traffic along Winter Street between Barnstable Road and North Street. The tree removal work is expected to be completed by Friday, June 11, 2021, weather permitting. Normal work hours will be between 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM throughout the week. Through traffic will be maintained as best possible during the tree work, however, there may be delays during isolated periods while there are overhead hazards. Police details will be on site to direct traffic as needed. Motorists are advised to seek alternate routes to avoid the construction work. As always,

please slow down and use extreme caution when traveling through the road construction areas, and follow posted safety and detour signs

## \*CONTINUES\* National Grid Gas Pipe Installation, Anchor Lane

National Grid, through their contractor Fraser Engineering, is planning on replacing the Anchor Lane Regulator Station, which will include removal of the existing regulator station and installation of a prefabricated 3 layer regulator station, and new gas lines that will tie into the existing 10" gas main located along the Route 28 roadway shoulder. Work will take place on the corner of Anchor Lane and Falmouth Rd (Route 28) in Cotuit. Construction is expected to begin on **April 19, 2021** and anticipated to last to **September 1, 2021**. Weather pending, construction will be on-going, Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM to 4:30 PM until completion of this phase of the project. Portions of Anchor Lane travel lanes will be restricted, and work on Falmouth Road will include temporary lane closures, which will be controlled by police details. As always, please slow down and use extreme caution when traveling through the road construction areas, and follow posted safety and detour signs.

\*CONTINUES\* Rendezvous Lane Wastewater Pump Station Replacement Project

The Town of Barnstable's contractor, Robert B. Our Co., Inc. is under contract to complete a wastewater pump station replacement project at the intersection of Rendezvous Lane, Kent Road and Salten Point Road. The project involves a new below grade precast concrete wet well and valve vault, pumping system, control panel, standby generator and gravity sewer main to replace the existing wastewater pump station at the Town Right of Way to Barnstable Harbor at the end of Rendezvous Lane. The improvements are necessary to replace the existing pump station approaching the end of its intended service life and to relocate the new pump station above the FEMA base flood elevation. Typical work hours are 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM, with groundwater dewatering pumps and sewer bypass pumps occasionally requiring 24/7 operation. Rendezvous Lane at the southern intersection of Salten Point Road to the northern intersection of Salten Point Road will remain closed due to construction activities until May 28, 2021. The Town Way to Water will remain accessible via Kent Road to Salten Point Road for the duration of the project, unless otherwise noted.

## **\*UPDATED\*** Drainage & Pavement Improvements on Wheeler Road in Marstons Mills

Drainage and pavement improvements on Wheeler Road in Marstons Mills are currently on-going and will continue during the week of June 7, 2021. Work will include installation of new drainage system equipment, pulverizing and grading of the roadway sub-base, installation of new asphalt pavement and restoration of all disturbed areas. Please use caution and safe speeds when traveling on Wheeler Road during construction operations.

## \*UPDATED\* Drainage Improvements on Lake Shore Drive in Marstons Mills

The Towns contractor, Tasco Construction, will continue drainage improvements at five (5) locations along Head of the Pond Rd and Lake Shore Drive in Marstons Mills. The work includes installation of new drainage systems, repairs to existing drainage systems, adjustment of drainage structure castings, and restoration of any areas disturbed during construction. Normal work hours will be between 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM, Monday through Friday. It is anticipated that work will be completed by June 11<sup>th</sup> with paving anticipated the week of June 14<sup>th</sup>. Through traffic will be maintained throughout construction. Any lane closures will be supported with police details to direct traffic. Motorists are advised to seek alternate routes to avoid the construction work.

## \*CONTINUES\* Water Works Construction on Longview Drive in Centerville

The water works construction project is ongoing on Longview Drive in Hyannis. This project included installation of 500 feet of 8 inch water main and move the temporary interconnection with the COMM water system to a vacant lot on Longview Drive. This roadway work is complete. The new building

enclosure has been completed. Landscaping work remains on the site. The project is anticipated to be completed by June 11, 2021. The metal container will be enclosed in a building appropriate for the neighborhood. Normal works hours will be between 8:00 AM and 4:40 PM.

## \*CONTINUES\* MassDOT Schedules Intersection Improvements at Falmouth Road (Route 28) at Osterville West Barnstable Road

MassDOT Construction operations on the intersection at Falmouth Road (Route 28) at Osterville West Barnstable Road are ongoing and will continue through to July 2021. The road has been redesigned to include exclusive left turn lanes and improve bicycle and pedestrian accommodation as part of the proposed safety improvement work. The work to be done consists of furnishing and installing of new traffic signal equipment at the intersection including emergency vehicle pre-emption system, bicycle and vehicles loop detectors, construction of ADA compliant wheelchair ramps, sidewalks, and driveways, box widening, pavement milling and resurfacing, new pavement markings and signs, drainage improvements, water distribution modifications, existing utility pole relocations, installation of granite curbing, loam and seeding. Work will be performed during the day, Monday through Friday 7:00 AM-3:30 PM. Traffic control will include all required signage, channeling devices for lane shifts and alternating one-way traffic as required. Police details/ flaggers will be used as needed. Visit www.mass511.com, a website which provides real-time traffic and incident advisory information, and allows users to subscribe to text and email alerts for traffic conditions. Follow MassDOT on Twitter @MassDOT to receive regular updates on road and traffic conditions. ## \*CONTINUES\* Bumps River Bridge Repairs on South Main Street in

## **Centerville/Main Street in Osterville**

Work on the bridge is scheduled to continue into June 2021. Normal work hours are 7:00 AM to 5:30 PM, Monday through Friday. Remaining work will include improving riprap at bridge abutments, bridge deck repairs, improving endblocks and guardrail connections, and concrete repairs. The contractor is expected to deploy their construction craft from McCarthy's Landing (aka Hayward Landing) at 40 Hayward Road in Centerville. This may create brief delays for other users when the contractor is using the landing. The ramp will still be available for public access. The contractor is responsible for maintaining small vessel navigational access under the bridge at all times during construction. Mariners are urged to use caution and go slow when approaching and moving through the work area. Divers may be in the water at times during construction operations. Mariners are required to maintain proper distance from Dive and Alpha flags based on Maritime law. The bridge will remain open to traffic throughout construction. During this work there will be temporary single-lane closures with signs and police officers to direct traffic past the work zone.

\*UPDATED\* Sidewalk, Traffic Signal, Water Distribution, and Associated Improvements on Independence Drive in Hyannis and Barnstable Village, and on Portions of Mary Dunn Road, Kidd's Hill Road, and Attucks Lane in Barnstable Village The contractor will be completing punch list items through June 11<sup>th</sup>. Normal work hours are 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM, Monday through Friday. Work will include a new sidewalk and additional drainage systems the full length of Independence Drive, on Mary Dunn Road a short distance south of Independence Drive, on Kidd's Hill Road from Independence Drive to Merchants Way, and on Attucks Lane from Independence Drive to Wilkens Lane. The work will also include a new traffic signal system at the intersection of Attucks Lane & Wilkens Lane; a watermain extension on portions of Attucks Lane and Independence Drive; and additional street lights on portions of Independence Drive and Kidd's Hill Road. During active construction there will be lane closures with signs, cones/construction barrels, and police details or flaggers if necessary to direct traffic past the work zones.

## \*CONTINUES\* Roadway Improvements on Portions of Main Street (Route 6A) and Mill Way in Barnstable Village

Construction is scheduled to continue into spring 2021. Normal work hours are 7:00 AM to 3:30 PM, Monday through Friday. Remaining work includes utility line transfers and pole removals in a few locations (by utility companies); constructing a sidewalk from Main Street to the County Complex parking lot east end; installing street lights; refurbishing traffic signals; and other associated work. During active construction there will be lane closures or temporary detours with signs and police details or flaggers to direct traffic past or around the work zones.
