Going on now through through March, from 7:00AM to 5:00 PM, West Main Street will be closed from Strawberry Hill Road to Pleasant Park Avenue as shown in Figure 1 below. In addition, Strawberry Hill Road from Pine Street to Craigville Beach Road and Craigville Beach Road from Lake Elizabeth Drive to Centerville Avenue will remain closed during the same timeframe. The closures are necessary due to work associated with the gravity sewer main installation work. Formal road closure and detour will be in place, with resident and business access only.

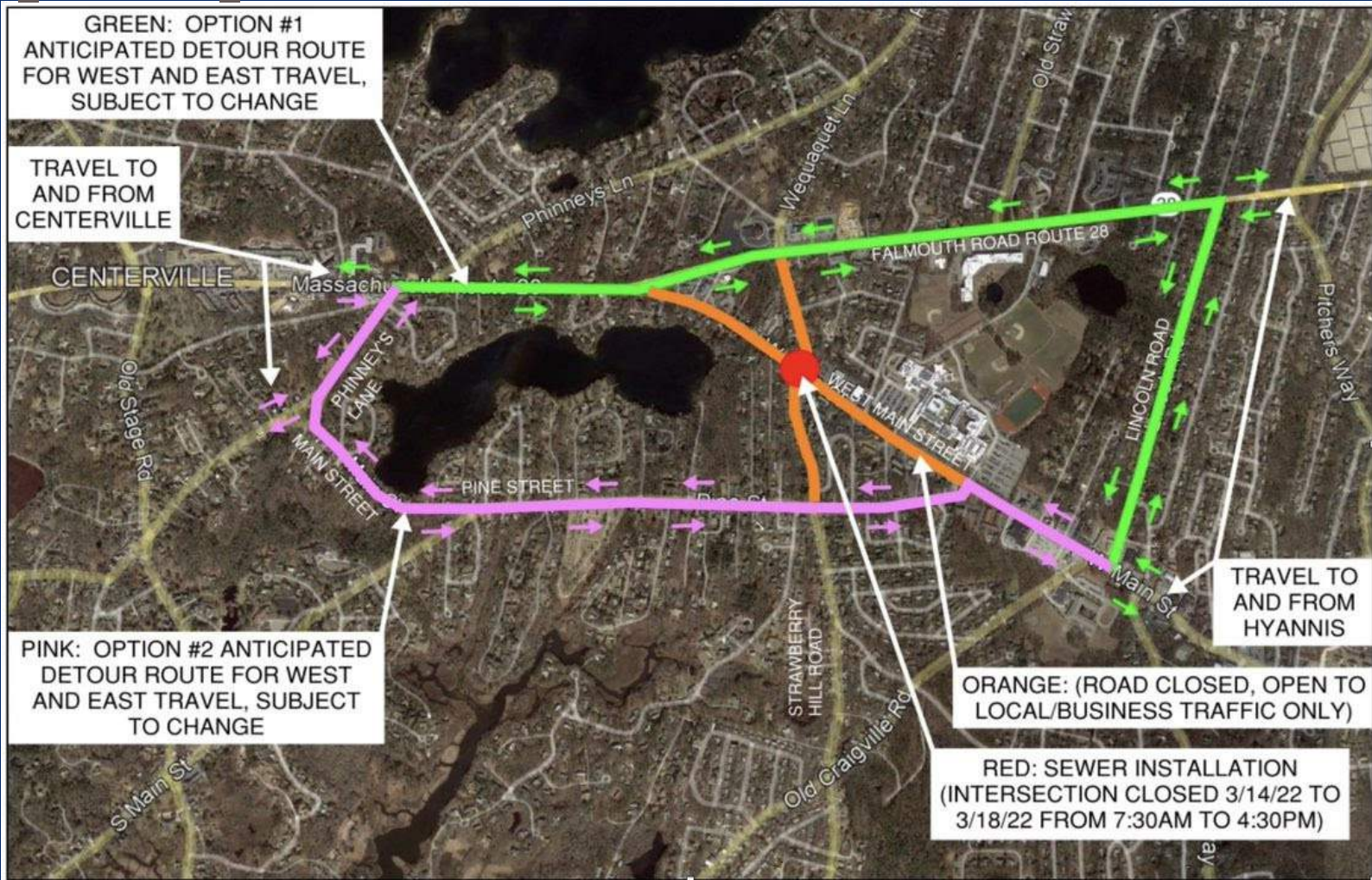


Figure 2: Overall Road Closure, Week of March 14th

DURING THE WEEK OF MARCH 14 TO MARCH 18, FROM 7:30AM TO 4:30 PM, WEST MAIN STREET WILL BE CLOSED TO THROUGH TRAFFIC FROM FALMOUTH ROAD (ROUTE 28) TO PINE STREET TO FACILITATE NECESSARY SEWER WORK IN THE INTERSECTION OF WEST MAIN STREET AND STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD.



IN ADDITION, STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD FROM FALMOUTH ROAD (ROUTE 28) TO CRAIGVILLE BEACH ROAD AND CRAIGVILLE BEACH ROAD FROM LAKE ELIZABETH DRIVE TO STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD WILL REMAIN CLOSED TO THROUGH TRAFFIC DURING THE SAME TIMEFRAME. THE INTERSECTIONS OF STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD WITH PINE STREET AND OLD CRAIGVILLE ROAD WILL REMAIN OPEN FOR TRAVEL. FORMAL ROAD CLOSURE AND POSTED DETOURS WILL BE IN PLACE. ALL CLOSED ROADWAYS WILL REMAIN ACCESSIBLE TO RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES THROUGHOUT CONSTRUCTION. AS ALWAYS, PLEASE SLOW DOWN AND USE EXTREME CAUTION WHEN TRAVELING THROUGH THE ROAD CONSTRUCTION AREAS, AND FOLLOW POSTED SAFETY AND DETOUR SIGNS.

Low Lying Roads: Barnstable

The Cape Cod Commission and the Woods Hole Group conducted the Barnstable Low Lying Roads Workshop #1 on March 7th.
