
## Community Vision, Goals, and Strategic Actions




FIFTH ANNUAL ATTORNEY GENERAL'S AWARD FOR  
DISTINGUISHED SERVICE IN COMMUNITY POLICING

The Justice Department announced on March 17th the recipients of the Fifth Annual Attorney General's Award for Distinguished Service in Community Policing. This year's awards recognize the exceptional work of 18 law enforcement officers and deputies from 12 jurisdictions across the country.



Officer Danielle St. Peter's commitment to the Barnstable Police Community Impact Unit (CIU) has dramatically benefited local residents. The CIU works with partner agencies to bring medical care, substance abuse treatment, mental health counseling, and housing services to homeless and disadvantaged populations. St. Peter routinely assumes the role of case manager, counselor, and problem solver by using an individualized approach to de-escalate tense situations and connect people with services tailored to their needs.

"Love your local water. It's a Cape Cod Thing." is a campaign of Barnstable County Government and Cape Cod Cooperative Extension to protect our drinking water.



Household hazardous waste (HHW) collections protect our local drinking water. Most chemicals are too toxic to throw away in regular trash or dump down the drain, so collections for residents are being held to take that waste off your hands and keep it out of our water supply.

We define Residents as people who own a home, own a second home, are tenants, or landlords in the town. Proof of residency includes one of the following: Drivers License with in-town address or tax bill.

Not a Resident or Sticker Holder? You can still participate for a fee.





**Going on now through through March, from 7:00AM to 5:00 PM, West Main Street will be closed from Strawberry Hill Road to Pleasant Park Avenue as shown in Figure 1 below. In addition, Strawberry Hill Road from Pine Street to Craigville Beach Road and Craigville Beach Road from Lake Elizabeth Drive to Centerville Avenue will remain closed during the same timeframe. The closures are necessary due to work associated with the gravity sewer main installation work. Formal road closure and detour will be in place, with resident and business access only.**

## WEST MAIN STREET, STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD AND CRAIGVILLE BEACH ROAD CLOSURES




### CONTINUING THROUGH MARCH 21ST

FROM 7:30AM TO 4:30 PM, WEST MAIN STREET WILL BE CLOSED TO THROUGH TRAFFIC FROM FALMOUTH ROAD (ROUTE 28) TO PINE STREET TO FACILITATE NECESSARY SEWER WORK IN THE INTERSECTION OF WEST MAIN STREET AND STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD.



IN ADDITION, STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD FROM FALMOUTH ROAD (ROUTE 28) TO CRAIGVILLE BEACH ROAD AND CRAIGVILLE BEACH ROAD FROM LAKE ELIZABETH DRIVE TO STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD WILL REMAIN CLOSED TO THROUGH TRAFFIC DURING THE SAME TIMEFRAME. THE INTERSECTIONS OF STRAWBERRY HILL ROAD WITH PINE STREET AND OLD CRAIGVILLE ROAD WILL REMAIN OPEN FOR TRAVEL.

FORMAL ROAD CLOSURE AND POSTED DETOURS WILL BE IN PLACE. ALL CLOSED ROADWAYS WILL REMAIN ACCESSIBLE TO RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES THROUGHOUT CONSTRUCTION. AS ALWAYS, PLEASE SLOW DOWN AND USE EXTREME CAUTION WHEN TRAVELING THROUGH THE ROAD CONSTRUCTION AREAS, AND FOLLOW POSTED SAFETY AND DETOUR SIGNS.
