

CodeRED Message Sent to Barnstable Residents on Thursday, March 19, 2020 Effective Friday, March 20, 2020, as a precautionary measure to prevent and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and in the interest of the health and well-being of our employees and the residents of the Town of Barnstable, most town buildings are closed to the public. It is our hope that we will re-open to the public on Monday, April 6th. We are making adjustments to our business operations to ensure resources are focused where the need is greatest. Please understand the fluid nature of this situation and that we are reassessing and adapting our response as needed to this developing situation. Public access to 200 Main Street and the Town Hall Offices is now by appointment only. The Barnstable Police Department has an emergency notification system. This system was used during the recent winter storms. Make sure you are on our list. Sign up here today. What is CodeRED and why is it important to me? CodeRED is an emergency notification service by which town officials can notify Barnstable residents and businesses by telephone, cellular phone, text message, or electronic mail about time-sensitive emergency situations or important community alerts. The system is capable of sending messages only to specific neighborhoods or the entire town. Only authorized officials are allowed access to use the system. 
Meals for Any Student in ALL Communities

Grab & Go Program for Older Adults

In order to help meet the needs of older adults during the COVID-19 crisis, the Barnstable Council on Aging is happy to announce a new initiative which will provide Grab & Go breakfast and lunch to Barnstable residents over the age of 60. We hope this effort will serve as an additional safety mechanism for older adults who are especially vulnerable to the coronavirus. The program is designed to ensure proper nutrition for older adults, and in addition to addressing food insecurity, will also help those who drive but may feel uncomfortable going to grocery stores. Beginning Monday, March 23, meals will be distributed curbside from the front entrance of the Barnstable Adult Community Center, 825 Falmouth Rd, Hyannis, Monday through Friday, from 10:00 AM-12:00 PM. This is a pick-up service, and participants will not need to leave their cars. There are no reservations, and distribution will be on a first-come/first-serve basis. Strict safety protocols will be followed. Should you or someone you know be homebound and in need of a home-delivered meal, please contact Elder Services of Cape Cod and the Islands (ESCCI) about the Meals on Wheels program.
